



Dr. Megan O'Connell is a co-investigator on a recently funded New Frontiers in Research Fund (NFRF) Transformation Grant for \$24,000,000 CAD, led by Dr. Jennifer Walker of McMaster University. This is a six-year Indigenous-led project to transform brain health and develop a bundle of dementia assessment tools tailored specifically to Indigenous communities.


RaDAR Memory Clinic Locations (2025)






