Heather Alford, MSc



 There were 6 memory clinics held in 5 communities between February 1st and March 31st where teams met with a total of 10 new patients and families.




On February 19th the Assiniboia Memory Clinic






AHSN 2024-2025 Annual Report



We are looking for **breast cancer survivors** to take part in a new study to characterize upper limb movements in functional tasks.

ELIGIBLE PARTICIPANTS MUST:

- Be between 18 and 70 years old
- Have had mastectomy OR reconstructive surgery for breast cancer more than 6 months ago
- Be able to safely participate in physical activities
- Be available for 1 session of approximately 2 hours at our laboratory at the University of Saskatchewan

Participants will be asked to complete a number of arm-focused tasks while your motion and muscle activity are measured with surface sensors. Ultrasound images of your shoulder will also be taken.
