**Methods / Process**

*Summarize the methods used to carry out the project objectives. Discuss sample or audience targeted, the data or information used, and how the sample was collected by the researcher or practitioner. In the case of a programmatic abstract, discuss the audience targeted and major points of the program.*

**Results / Findings**

*Summarize the major findings or educational outcomes resulting from the project or program.*

**Discussion / Implications**

*Provide context to the findings. What do they mean in terms of the agricultural or rural health and safety audience, locally, regionally, nationally, and internationally? What are the high-level conclusions from the research or program? Describe the impacts or implications of this work and how others may use them.*
