Summit 8 Keynote Presenters: Dr. Dallas Seitz & Dr. Jayna Holroyd-Leduc

Dr. Dallas Seitz, MD FRCPC is an Assistant Professor and Clinician Scientist in the Division of Geriatric Psychiatry at Queen's University. He completed his MD at the University of Saskatchewan in 2003 and his psychiatric residency training at Queen's University. Dr. Seitz completed fellowship training in clinical epidemiology at the University of Toronto and completed his PhD in Clinical Epidemiology and Health Services Research at the Institute of Health Policy, Management and Evaluation



at the University of Toronto. His current research examines health service utilization of older adults with psychiatric disorders; evaluation of the safety and efficacy of treatments for geriatric mental health conditions; and, knowledge translation in geriatric mental health.

Dr. Jayna M. Holroyd-Leduc, MD

FRCPC is an Associate Professor in the Departments of Medicine and Community Health Sciences at the University of Calgary, Alberta, Canada. She received her medical degree and then completed residency training in Internal Medicine and Geriatrics at the University of Toronto, Ontario, Canada. She completed a research fellowship in Geriatrics and Quality Improvement as a VA Quality Scholar at the University of California, San Francisco, USA. Her research interests include knowledge synthesis and translation



focused on improving care provided to older adults. She is the Scientific Director of the Alberta Seniors Health Strategic Clinical Network, the KT Chair of TVN (Technology Evaluation in the Elderly Network) NCE, and an Associate Editor for the Canadian Medical Association Journal.
