

The evening of **October 25th** is an informal scientific poster session from 7:00 to 9:30 pm which provides the opportunity to meet researchers and learn more about dementia care research in our province and across Canada. The Summit meeting is held on **October 26th** from 8:00 am until about 4:30 pm. The Summit will feature a keynote guest, knowledge sharing, research presentations, and dedicated time for participants to meet and network.

**Summit Keynote Presenter:
Dr. Mark Rapoport, MD FRCPC**



Mark Rapoport, MD, is a geriatric neuropsychiatrist at Sunnybrook Health Sciences Centre, and an associate professor of psychiatry in the division of geriatric psychiatry at University of Toronto. He is also a member of the Canadian Driving Research


Initiative for Vehicular Safety in the Elderly (CanDRIVE), and an associate editor of the Canadian Journal of Geriatrics. Dr. Rapoport received his medical degree from McMaster University in 1995, and subsequently trained in psychiatry at the University of Toronto. Dr. Rapoport's main areas of research are traumatic brain injury in the elderly and the risk of motor vehicle conditions associated with neurological and psychiatric diseases and their treatments. Drs. Gary Naglie and Mark Rapoport are leading the Canadian Consortium on Neurodegeneration in Aging: Team 16 in developing a program to support driving retirement. A Reminder to Register for Summit 9

- Summit Registration is open **to all invitees who have received an email notification from the Summit organizers.**

RaDAR Team update: Foundation Grant

On July 15th, Dr. Debra Morgan and team received news from the Canadian Institutes of Health Research that their Foundation Grant application *Design and evaluation of integrated primary health care practices for dementia in rural and remote settings* was awarded. This award means \$2.3M to support research activities over the next seven years - more information about the grant and associated research will be provided at the Summit.
