The evening of Tuesday, November 5th will be co-hosted with Alzheimer Society of Saskatchewan as an informal scientific poster Spotlight on Research evening from 6:30 to 9:00 pm, with a brief program at 7:30 pm. Tuesday evening provides a casual setting to meet researchers, students, and other participants and learn more about dementia care research in Saskatchewan and across Canada. The program will feature a presentation by Dr. Saskia Sivananthan, Chief Research and KTE Officer, Alzheimer Society of Canada. The Summit meeting will be held on Wednesday, November 6th from 8:00 am

until about 4:00 pm. The Summit day will feature keynote presenter Dr. Rachel Herron from Brandon University, knowledge sharing, research presentations, and dedicated time for participants to meet and network.

## November 6th, Summit Keynote Presenter: Dr. Rachel Herron

Dr. Rachel Herron, the Keynote presenter on November 6th, is an Associate Professor in the Department of Geography and Environment at Brandon University and a Canada Research Chair in Rural and Remote Mental Health. Her current research examines the vulnerability and complexity of care relationships, social inclusion and meaningful engagement for people living with dementia, and the diversity of lived experiences of rural mental health.

Dr. Herron is the founding Director of the Centre for Critical Studies of Rural Mental Health where she works with other researchers, professionals, students and community partners to develop community-based solutions to rural mental health needs. Dr. Herron's recent collaborative work involves a partnership with Canada's National Ballet School, the Alzheimer's Society, and other rural community partners to investigate the potential of an innovative program, Baycrest NBS Sharing Dance Seniors, to enhance social inclusion and quality of life for people living with dementia and their carers. Ultimately, Dr. Herron's work seeks to create more supportive environments for people living with dementia and their carers.



### November 5th, Poster Session Spotlight on Research guest speaker: Dr. Saskia Sivananthan



Dr. Saskia Sivananthan, PhD, is a neuroscientist and health data scientist who provides overall leadership to the research & KTE programs and initiatives at the Alzheimer Society of Canada. She has extensive experience in health system development working with governments on health services, policy and strategies to improve health for older adults. Prior to her current position, Dr. Sivananthan served as a senior strategy advisor, consulting for the World Health Organization on its overall global dementia strategy.

She co-drafted the WHO's Global Action Plan on the Public Health Response to Dementia which received unanimous support and was adopted at the 170th World Health Assembly by all 194 member states. She and her team were also responsible for developing the WHO Global Dementia Observatory, an online platform for collating data to support countries to develop evidence-based policies in dementia and monitoring progress toward targets proposed in the dementia action plan. An active researcher, Saskia holds a PhD from the School of Population and Public Health from the University of British Columbia and an MSc in Neurology and Neuroscience from McGill
